The Royal College of Midwives has provided evidence to the NHS Pay Review Body that birthrates in the England have increased by over 18% since 2001. Over the same period, the Royal College identified the numbers of midwives in England have increased by just over 8%.

In England, maternity spending has been cut at least once in each region since the start of the baby boom (information from answers to Parliamentary Questions). The Royal College of Midwives estimates that an extra 5,000 midwives are needed in England to deliver a safe, quality maternity service and to meet Government maternity targets for England.

The Government have set out in their 'Maternity Matters' document of offering women in England a wider choice in maternity services. This includes a choice of how to access maternity care, of place of birth (including at home or midwife led unit), type of antenatal care and place of postnatal care. This is due to be in place at the end of this year (i.e. 2009)
